Grouchy Waiter: "Who told you?"

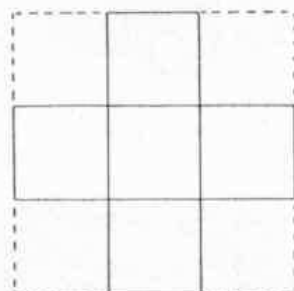
Diner: "A little swallow."
