



The Secretary's Notes

The first Winter Session has now commenced, and promises to be very busy and enjoyable, judging from the letters received from Club Leaders and Secretaries. Many Clubs are already preparing for Exhibitions to be held during the Session, with a view to augmenting Club funds. Programmes for the Winter Sessions are naturally very varied, for each Club Leader includes the subject in which his members are particularly interested. I am very pleased to find that the majority of our Clubs run either a Football Team or a Gymnasium during the Winter.

For the benefit of those readers who are not members of the Guild I would state that the Guild was first started at the request of Meccano boys, who had formed small Clubs amongst themselves. They felt that their Clubs should have an organising centre at Headquarters to which they could look for guidance. As many Meccano boys lived where no Clubs were established, however, it was decided to form a Guild for individual membership as well as for members of Clubs. Although there are now over 140 affiliated Clubs, there are yet many towns in which there are no Clubs. If there is not a Club near enough for you to join, you may become a "lone member" of the Guild, and if you wish to do so you may correspond with another member either in this country or abroad. There are over 30,000 Guild members in all parts of the world.

The objects of the Meccano Guild are (1) To make every boy's life brighter and happier. (2) To foster clean-mindedness, truthfulness, ambition and initiative in boys. (3) To encourage boys in the pursuit of their studies and hobbies, and especially in the development of their knowledge of mechanical and engineering principles. A member of the Guild promises to promote these objects by his own example. He promises to be helpful to others; to be clean in thought and habit, and to be determined to make progress. He also promises to wear the Guild Badge on all possible occasions; to recognise and acknowledge all other members wearing the Guild Badge and to render them help in case of need. 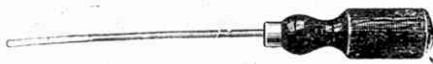
